

An Anatomy of Understanding

Catherine Z. Elgin (Harvard University)

I discuss recent work on the epistemology of understanding. I explicate the distinction between propositional understanding – that is, understanding expressed in a proposition or a sentence – and objectual understanding – understanding of a topic or subject matter. I argue that since science affords understanding of its subject matters, and uses models, idealizations, and distortions to do so, objectual understanding cannot consist exclusively of true beliefs.
